He made quick progress through his rehab stay of two weeks following heart surgery, during which he also celebrated his birthday with fellow guests and Laurel associates. Hershberger was excited to return to a more regular routine at home and credited the care he received at The Laurels of Massillon for helping in his fast recovery.

"I'm going to be able to drive

again on August 17 and I'm bringing in donuts for everyone sometime soon after that," Hershberger said upon receiving his certificate of completion. "I am very thankful for my care here from nursing and therapy. God bless you all!"

The state-of-the-art rehab facility at The Laurels of Massillon makes it possible to not only offer seven-day-a-week therapy for current guests, but also outpatient therapy for the community. Many former guests elect to receive additional treatment with the rehabilitation team, led by Ramsey, upon arrival home.

Hershberger will be one of them, as he plans on returning to the facility with his wife for additional physical and occupational therapy.
