The Laurels of University Park Completes MDS Training

The Laurels of University Park team earned their MDS certificates at "MDS 101" training in August. MDS, or "Minimum Data Set," is a method of assessing Guests to ensure that they are getting the care they need. It is also how facilities are paid by the government. Under MDS, each department interviews every Guest in the facility to determine their dietary needs, activity interests, nursing needs, therapy needs, social service needs, and functional abilities. The team then works on a comprehensive care plan that is individualized for each Guest at the facility. The training ensured that all Associates at The Laurels of University Park are up-to-date on all government regulations and information.

A Breakthrough in Care Management for The Laurels of Willow Creek

Associates at **The Laurels of Willow Creek** completed a series of trainings for the Point Click Care (PCC) software in August. PCC is a leading cloud-based Electronic Health Record (EHR) program that helps long-term post-acute care providers streamline and manage the complete the lifecycle of Guest care.



PCC is designed to support quality compliance and help skilled nursing facilities adapt to the changing technological environment in health care. Moving to PCC will help The Laurels of Willow Creek continue to offer the best quality of care without compromise.

The Laurels of Willow Creek is the first Laurel facility in Virginia to undergo this training and was the first to complete the transition to the new software. More than 50 Associates—including Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, and Managers—underwent intensive training under the expert tutelage of RN Thomas Durst, QA Nurse and Clinical Coordinator for Electronic Health Records for Laurel Health Care.








The Laurels of University Park
